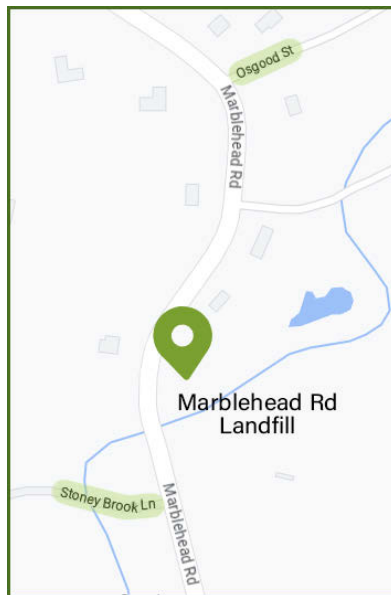


Where to Bring Your Yard Waste

If at home composting isn't for you, please bring all of your yard waste to the Marblehead Road Landfill in town to be disposed of correctly.

There is no road side pickup for yard waste.



At the Landfill, all yard waste is composted, or recycled into loam for the public.

Thank you for disposing of yard waste correctly!

The site is open seasonally, on the second and fourth Saturdays of each month from April until November.

Compost:

- Grass Clippings
- Hay or Straw
- Leaves
- Wood Chips or Mulch
- Brush

What happens when you dispose of Yard Waste Incorrectly?

- If yard waste is left in your yard,
wind and rain can carry it into the
Stormwater drainage system,
where it could cause a blockage.
- Small amounts of yard waste in the
recycling can contaminate a large
portion of recyclables, which then
need to be thrown away.
- Grass clippings contain fertilizers
and pesticides that can
contaminate rivers and lakes and
contribute to their impairment.



Invasive Species

While you are doing yard work, be
aware of invasive species such as:

- Japanese Knotweed
- Burning Bush
- Giant Hogweed
- Autumn Olive
